2017 REPORT - JUNIOR VICE PRESIDENT

November 2016 - International Festival of Hockey. Hockey Victoria called for volunteers aged Under 11 to be ambassadors (mascots) for the teams as they walked out on to the pitch. I sent the message out and got 9 very keen Casey juniors responding. Alice and Livinia Gray, Asia and Chloe Renouf, Lara Woods, Jhai Beare, Thomas Edwards, Tallis Pritchard and Alfonso de Leon were ambassadors for the Australia vs India women's match on the 23rd November. They did a great job and had a fabulous time.

Hookin2Hockey – running in two centres. One at the Berwick ground and one in Lakeside Primary School, Pakenham. Berwick run by Brenda Buckland and Jeff Reidy and Pakenham by Sarah Chaffey and Tegen Hyland. 26 kids involved in Hookin2Hockey across the two centres.

U10 changed from HV run competition to smaller, zoned inter club competition. Spoke to Frankston Hockey Club who told me they had about 30 U10s and Peninsula had about the same so they were not interested in travelling to Casey as they would run their own competition but we were welcome to play all our games there. Not a great option! Left messages with Dandenong about joining forces but had no response by phone or email. The day prior to team entries closing I was still trying to get in contact with someone from Dandenong about the U10s so abandoned that idea and with the support of Bryce Davis and Jeff Smit as coaches, entered another U12 District team, elevating a lot of very inexperienced U10s. We felt telling kids who had previously worn the Casey uniform and played competitive hockey that they had to return to Hookin2Hockey would not be in the best interests for them or the club. Dandenong got back in touch about an U10 competition the next day, but it was too late for us.

Had interest for an U18 team but could not get the numbers to get a team together.

Registered 6 junior teams with HV. 2xU12 Mixed District, U14 Pennant Girls, U14 Pennant Mixed, U16 Pennant Girls and U16 Pennant Mixed.

Sadly we did not get the numbers for the U14 Pennant Girls so withdrew that team, dividing the girls between U14 Mixed and U16 Girls, which allowed a couple of U14 boys to move into U16 Mixed to bolster their numbers which were a bit light on at the beginning of the season.

Training began on the running track behind the hockey pitch and at the Casey Indoor centre in Cranbourne and Beaconhills College Pakenham.

Season began on April 28th.

September school holidays we ran a skills clinic with Glenn Simpson (former Kookaburra), who ran a clinic for the U12s and combined the U14s and U16s. It was well supported. Half, or 13 to be precise, of the U12s came along to their session and another 15 to the older session.

U12 Maroon – Coach-Jeff Smit, Assistant coach-Thomas Jelavic, Manager-Matthew Jelavic. This was the younger of the two teams, everyone 10 or under and they did an amazing job to finish 5th on the ladder. They got to sing the club song 4 times so they'll all know the words for next season.

U12 White – Coach-Bryce Davis, Manager-Liz Edwards. This team was not much older with the average age being 10 and 3 months but they a bit more experience and these kids ended 4th on the

ladder, won the semi final, and lost the preliminary to the eventual competition winner. Awesome effort

U14 Mixed – Coach-Jeff Reidy, Manager-Allan McDonald. Only won the one game for the season but a solid year. A mix of brand new players and experience and were hit pretty hard with injuries (none due to hockey).

U16 Pennant Mixed – Coach – Daniel Godfrey, Manager – Stephen Noney. 3 wins and a draw for the season. Ended up with 17 players which is not the worst problem to have, but it is tricky to manage. The season was more competitive than the ladder would suggest.

U16 Pennant Girls – Coach- Maddie Storr, Manager – Dean Walsh. Fabulous year, playing in the Grand Final again this year but sadly going down 3-2 to Greensborough. Great effort.

Presentation Night was held on Friday 15th September in the basketball stadium adjacent to the ground. Approximately 150 people came which was great as we had 72 kids playing junior hockey and another 26 Hookin2Hockey. Fabulous turnout.

2017 REPORT - WOMEN'S VICE PRESIDENT

This continued fitness program really helped us in climbing the ladder in the very competitive VL1 grade. Our struggles came when we played the lower sides that we would normally have expected good wins. These mixed results meant that we needed to rely on other team results going into the final round before we knew we were in the finals. As luck would have it we squeezed into the 4th position on the ladder and although we played our heart out in the first final we could not get the goals on the board. On reflection I believe 4th position was a true indication of where we are at and I am sure it is a stepping-stone to future success. Thank you to our 1st coach Andrew Harris, his passion and belief is exceptional. Also a big thank you to our team manager Kym Rinehart, Kym took this job on for the first time this season and did a great job, for someone that needed to learn new skills such as the tech bench, she really showed up other clubs who have been doing it for several years.

Our 2nds team was really a development side this season, with the loss of several experienced players due to injury; we were required to push up many of our young up and coming players. Up to round 9 the best results were a couple of draws, but the great persistence and effort from players and coaches came through in the second half of the season finishing with 5 wins and 5th on the ladder. An excellent result with many great young players (Haley, Charlotte, Darcy, Jamieson and Nakita) playing all season in the 2's and showing the way. Thanks to coach Chris Wood for persisting with this young group throughout the season, Chris showed huge confidence and encouragement in the young players and the benefits will be seen for years to come. A big thank you to our team managers Allan & Anita McDonald, it is extremely important to have team managers for each team and this team was the hardest to find a suitable person. Although Allan was already team managing a men's and junior team, Allan and Anita stepped in just as the season started and did a great job. Thank you very much.

The 3rds team this season was entered into the Metro A grade. (up from Metro B in 2016). This decision was made to separate our 3rds and 4ths into different grades. This was always going to be a challenge, but the players fought out the season very well, always trying to improve their skills and making sure they had fun. As is often the case in the lower grades we had many players come in and out of the side. This totaled 37 players for the Metro A team, but most satisfying is the many juniors that got an opportunity including several under 14 players. This shows the future is bright for Casey in the women's unit. Thank you to Erika Storr for taking on the coaching role. Coaching the lower grades can be hard work and although Erika probably would have liked to play a few more games throughout the season, she continually put the team and coaching job first. Erika worked very hard

on developing playing with game plans and skills that aren't always discussed at this level at the same time as making sure the team had fun and enjoyed playing hockey. Also thank you to our team manager Sara Sonnberger, Sara is another club stalwart that is always happy to put her hand up and assist in anyway she can.

The 4ths team fought out a tough year, this team is filled with many players still learning the game (young and older) and often playing teams with experienced players that are in their late 20's and early 30's. With 33 different players playing in the Metro B side, it meant we rarely had issues filling the team. A huge thank you goes to our 4ths coach Brenda Buckland and team manager Leanne Gibson. This is easily the hardest on field job in the club and both these players put in 100% from the beginning to the end of the season and did a great job working together as a team. Your continued efforts to improve all players is a credit to you both - without you and people like yourselves the club would not survive. Everyone at the club should take note, as Brenda and Leanne are the perfect examples of what everyone should be striving to be off field.

Finally I would like to thank several people for their contributions throughout the season. Thank you to the committee, this season we had many challenges, but with great team work and support from the committee the future of the women's unit looks very bright.
